Special Activities this Week:

★ completed the first week of five full days of kindergarten (M,T,W,Th, F) and they did pretty well.

★ praised God for making us His own in such a marvelous way. Not only did He create us

physically, but He made us His own dear children through His Son Jesus. We are part of

His family. A great book is: God Knows Me! (from Psalm 139). Another fun book is: 7 Days of Awesome: A Creation Tale .

 $\star$  practiced drawing and decorating pictures of their bodies. Students are learning how to

add the torso between the head and legs. God did not put our arms and legs on our head.

Encourage your child to add more detail to his/her drawings at home as well. See our hall portraits.

★ started rotating tables for thematic center time. Each week students will have an art

activity at the blue table, a sight word book at the green table, letter printing/journal

writing/dictionary work at the red table, and a Math/Science activity at the yellow table.

This week they sorted letters by straight lines/ circles/ and curves, by tall/short, tail/no tail, etc.,

completed a "Me Book" complete with height and weight measurements, practiced printing

Mm, entered words beginning with m in a picture dictionary, wrote stories about "What is special about me?", practiced printing their names, and played a friendship memory match game that included matching names.....and much, much, more! You can see many of these activities in photos I post.

★ practiced many literacy skills during shared Reading time such as: rhyming, alliteration,

phonemic awareness, word placement, left-to-right progression, correct handwriting, etc. They practiced printing letters Aa, Bb, Cc, Dd, Ee, and Mm for our theme of "God made marvelous me".

★ had fun using more centers in the room. They are already doing a great job of starting to take care

of the library by placing books into the correct genre or author box and to look for the binding as they orient books into the box.

★ used big books in our class library and learned book handling skills. <u>This week the students learned that they will check out books</u> in our school library soon.. Next week when you see a library book in your child's backpack, please return the book by the due date.

★ sorted names, environmental print and pictures on the ABC magnet wall. They also had fun using letters to make their names.

★ compared day and night in Science and how to take care of the bodies God made in Health. Students learned what can be the same or different in the day and night sky. We learned about our upper and lower brain and brain connections for control.

★ learned expectations for P.E. and the difference between personal space, general space and boundaries. We practiced jumping with two feet, hopping on one foot and balancing, along with many locomotor skills.

★ sorted attribute blocks by color, shape, size, and thickness. We also learned how to play some Math games that are part of our work station time.
