## This week:

\*We learned how Jesus performed a miracle at the wedding in Cana. He cares about our every need and showed He can take care of problems big and small. The miracle showed He is God and most of all He has power to save.

### It was a very busy week. We:

- made 100 flags, glasses, and hats for a big 100th day parade.
- compared 100 collections by length and weight. We spread out our collections in the gym and made a “graph” to compare lengths. Gemma had the longest collection of 100 pipe cleaners. Graham, Liam, Henry, and Caleb had the lightest and shortest collections of beads. Gabriel had the heaviest collection of little cars.
- skip counted by ones, twos, fives, and tens.
- exercised to music to get fit as we counted to 100 and did different movements for each set of ten.
- had a relay race to sequence number strips to 100 in the gym by sets of ten.
- made 100<sup>th</sup> day posters to describe what we would buy with \$100.00, what we would look like in 100 years, what we can do 100 times, etc. Come take a look at them outside of our room sometime next week.
- played a hundreds cover up game to help us learn about the placement of digits in numerals. This game is helpful for those that may struggle with reversals. We also played a 100 dice game to help us learn how to “count on” when adding two dice together.
- played a “Race to \$1.00” game to help us practice coin identification.
- wrote a book about 100 wishes, 100 food choices, \$100 purchases, and 100 year old faces.
- read a variety of books this week. We counted words by listening to sentences as well as counted words by looking at sentences.
- read a big book called “From One to One Hundred” and “From One to a Million Counting Concepts”. The kids were amazed to learn about numbers larger than 100.
- had fun exercising in the gym and playing a game to help us throw and catch.
- made special cards to give to people that may have loved ones in the hospital and also wrote thank you notes to thank Mrs. Krenzke for the gift that she gave the kindergarten class. She blessed us with a gift to thank our class for singing last Friday.

Put these words on flash cards for your child. Play matching games, Bingo, etc.

Please review the words listed above regularly with your child. Thanks!

I will ask your child to read these words to me for an assessment. Keep practicing regularly and have your child look for these words in other books you have at home as well. If your child is able to read these words already, encourage your child to use these words in his/her writing. See if he/she can spell them.

Also, please help your child learn to put on his/her shoes and socks independently. Help your child learn to tie his/her shoes.

♦ If your child does not know how to print 0-20 independently without looking at a model, please help your child.

♦ Please help your child to read any 3 letter word (consonant-vowel-consonant) that follows rules of Phonics.

★ Review the letters Aa, Bb, Cc, Dd, Ee, Ff, Gg, Hh, Ii, Jj, Kk, Ll, Mm, Nn, Oo, Pp, Qq, Rr, Ss, Tt, Uu, Vv, Ww, Xx, Yy, and Zz with your child. Help him/her to recognize them out of order. Talk about their sounds. Practice printing them.

★ Help your child to hold a pencil correctly. Only the pointer finger should be on top of the pencil.

# Re-Enrollment

**NOW OPEN** for 2019-2020  
for currently enrolled families



- 1) Log into your ParentsWeb Account
- 2) Click the apply/enroll tab to the left
- 3) Click the re-enrollment link
- 4) Start the enrollment packet

**The re-enrollment fee is \$125/child\* until March 22, 2019. It increases to \$150 per child on March 23, 2019.**

\*Fee for CHOICE scholarship students is absorbed by the scholarship.

**NOTE:** New Enrollment for community members will open on January 7th, 2019. **We expect our Kindergarten class to be at capacity** with returning students. We encourage currently enrolled families to complete their re-enrollment so that you have a spot in Kindergarten.
