Special Activities this Week:

*We continued to work hard on our song that we will sing Sunday, Jan. 21 at the 10:30a.m. service. They are wonderful little disciples that are so excited to share God's love with you and others in church this Sunday. I hope that everyone is able to make it. We also learned how we don't have to be afraid of things in life. We have the best Helper, Jesus! The students added their own pages to a little prayer book on Friday. Look for it in your child's backpack.

It was a very busy week. We:

- • had fun using 100 flags, glasses, and hats for a big 100th day parade.
- compared 100 collections by length and weight. We spread out our collections in the gym and made a "graph" to compare lengths. Nolan had the longest collection of candy, but Sylas, Teddy, and Nora were very close. Shalom had the shortest collection of sequins. Teddy had the heaviest collection of screws and Shalom's collection of sequins was the lightest. Allesia and Rachel also had the next shortest and lightest collections of beads.
- skip counted by ones, twos, fives, and tens.
- exercised to music to get fit as we counted to 100 and did different movements for each set of ten.
- made 100th day posters to describe what we would buy with \$100.00, what we would look like in 100 years, what we can do 100 times, etc. Come take a look at them outside of our room sometime next week.
- played a hundreds cover up game to help us learn about the placement of digits in numerals. This game is helpful for those that may struggle with reversals. We also played a 100 dice game to help us learn how to "count on" when adding one or two dice together.
- wrote a book about 100 wishes, 100 food choices, \$100 purchases, and 100 year old faces.
- read a variety of books this week. We counted words by listening to sentences as well as counted words by looking at sentences.
- read a big book called "From One to One Hundred" and "From One to a Million Counting Concepts". The kids were amazed to learn about numbers larger than 100.
- had fun exercising in the gym and playing a game to help us throw and catch.

Next week we plan to have more fun with 100 and we will celebrate National Lutheran Schools' Week. Don't forget to plan for each of the days using the sheet that is in your child's Friday Folder.

- We will have a relay race to sequence number strips to 100 in the gym by sets of ten.
- We will play a "Race to \$1.00" game to help us practice coin identification.
